Finance

Due to an FA ruling we are unable to publish results of U7's, U8's. However, we can name the goal scorers.

Whitehill U9's have had a superb start to the season winning 12-3 at Whiston Wildcats, Callum Walker and Tom Colley both hitting hat-tricks, with Connor Doyle, Curtis Jenkinson, George Colgrave, Todd Hadfield, Ben Mitcheson, and Rowan Hodgkinson completing the scoring.

They had a close victory against Beighton Magpies, winning by the odd goal in nine, Ben Mitcheson hit a double with Lewis Smith, Rowan Hodgkinson and Nathan Taylor also on target. The seniors played their first ever Rotherham FA Cup final and lost 3-2 against Wickersley.
